Since many of the programs have an audio component your child would benefit from the use of a headset so that they can focus on their computer without being distracted by the computers on either side of them. If you are able, please send to school earphones that you are comfortable leaving at school for the year. These will be labeled with your child's name, and kept in the library so that they are available whenever your child visits the computer lab.
